The victim's skull and mandible were found in a wooded rural area of Anderson Scout Camp Road in Houlton. Estimated year of death is 2001-2002.

2022 Update: Investigators with the St. Croix County Sheriff's Office and Wisconsin Department of Justice- Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) are hoping the public can help to identify a Jane Doe whose skull was found on October 21, 2002, near the St. Croix River. It was initially believed the woman was of Asian descent, but investigative genetic genealogists with the DNA Doe Project have now determined that she was of Swedish descent. It is believed that her relatives may have emigrated to the Minneapolis/St. Paul area. The woman was likely between 35 and 50 years old and she had widely spaced eyes, a flat face, and a pronounced forehead. Investigators speculate the skull had been deposited at the site within a year of discovery.

Potential family members may be needed to confirm her identity by providing a DNA sample.
